

# Toggenburg In-Saanen Terrain Park

## IN-SAANEN TERRAIN PARK UNVEILED

In-Saanen is the premier terrain park at Toggenburg. The features in this advanced level park include: Large size features and jumps, jump on rails with gaps and narrow rail surfaces; most difficult features.

## HOW TO GET IN

Access to the In-Saanen Park will be controlled at the entrance. Only those persons producing a valid park pass will be permitted onto the run. Temporary single day passes and complete season passes are available. All persons obtaining an In-Saanen Terrain Park pass must complete and sign this Release Agreement. For applicants under 19 years of age, the Release Agreement must be co-signed by a parent or legal guardian. In order to obtain a season's pass, riders must also watch the required safety training video.

## ARE YOU READY FOR THE IN-SAANEN PARK?

Since Highest Level contains most difficult features, we only want advanced and expert riders and skiers on the run. Generally speaking, you should be comfortable and competent on large or more difficult features before attempting the features in the In-Saanen Park. If in doubt about your experience level, first check out the Goat Pen Progression Park to hone your park riding skills.

## CAN YOU GET HURT?

Absolutely! Injuries are a common and expected part of using the In-Saanen Park. There is growing medical concern over the cumulative impact of repeat minor concussions. Helmets will not prevent all head injuries, but may lessen the severity of some injuries. Doctors are now recommending that in addition to helmets, skiers and snowboarders consider attaching chin protectors or mouth guards to their helmets. Helmets will not prevent spinal cord injuries. Although all skiing and snowboarding activities involve the risk of injury, airborne maneuvers in the In-Saanen Park increase this risk. Inverted aerial maneuvers substantially increase the risk of serious injury and are not recommended.

## WE HAVE RULES

Terrain Park Rules & Regulations and Freestyle Terrain Levels were developed for the Terrain Park and Half Pipes. The Alpine Responsibility Code applies to the entire ski area, including the In-Saanen Park. It is your responsibility to know the rules and abide by them.

## OUR RULES HAVE TEETH—DON'T GET BITTEN!

Getting tossed out of In-Saanen Park and facing loss of your In-Saanen Terrain Park pass and suspension of skiing and snowboarding privileges at Toggenburg for the season, is easy—simply try one or more of the following:

1. Bypass the entrance and slip into the Park from South Main or through the trees.
2. Overestimate your riding or skiing experience. If in doubt, stick to the Goat Pen.
3. Ignore the Terrain Park Rules and Regulations, the Alpine Responsibility Code, or requests or directions from the In-Saanen Terrain Park Crew, Ski Patrol or other Toggenburg staff.
4. Lend your In-Saanen park pass to a buddy who is either too lazy or too inexperienced to get his/her own. Both you and your buddy may end up on the sidelines for the season. Remember, the pass has your name on it – it is not transferable.

**Breach of the Alpine Responsibility Code or the Terrain Park Rules and Regulations may also result in a suspension from Toggenburg for the entire season. Don't let this happen to you or your friends! These rules have been put in place for your safety and protection. We need your help to make the system work so that we can continue to offer you the best terrain park experience possible.**
